## Interim Management Report of Fund Performance

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### Management Discussion of Fund Performance

#### Results of operations

For the six-month period ending June 30, 2022 (the "Period"), Series A of Empire Life Monthly Income Fund (the "Fund") returned -8.1%, net of fees. The net returns of other series of this Fund are provided under the section titled "Past Performance." The series have different returns due to the expenses charged to each series. The Fund's benchmark, the S&P/TSX Composite Total Return Index, broadly representative of the Canadian equity market, returned -9.9% for the same Period. Fund returns are reported net of all management fees and expenses unlike the performance of an index that does not pay fees or incur expenses.

The Fund's blended benchmark returned -10.7% for the Period. The blended benchmark is composed of 55% S&P/TSX 60 Index and 45% FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index. In the portfolio manager's view, this blended benchmark provides a more useful comparison to the performance of the Fund because it reflects the asset classes and market sectors in which the Fund invests.

The Fund outperformed its benchmark over the Period. Stock selection in Canadian equities and an elevated cash allocation contributed to the Fund's positive performance relative to the benchmark. The largest individual equity contributors to the Fund's performance included investments in Tourmaline Oil Corp, Boralex Inc., CES Energy Solutions, Topaz Energy Corp, and a significant underweight position in Shopify Inc. Detractors from the Fund's relative performance include overweight investments in Eguana Technologies Inc., BRP Inc., The Home Depot Inc., and Granite Real Estate Investment Trust.

In the portfolio manager's view, global equity and bond markets generally experienced losses during the Period as a result of the conflict between Russia and Ukraine, its effect in further stoking inflation concerns, and central banks raising interest rates in an attempt to combat inflation. These events negatively impacted the Fund's absolute returns.

#### Recent developments

During the Period, the portfolio manager reallocated a modest portion of the Fund from equities to fixed income securities with the intention of incrementally lowering the Fund's sensitivity to geopolitical and economic growth risks, given the higher inflation and interest rate environment.

At the end of the Period, the Fund held 209 equity and bond positions, compared to 186 at the beginning of the period. New positions added to the Fund include SPDR Gold Shares ETF, Franco Nevada Corp, Bristol Myers Squibb Company, and Nutrien Ltd. Positions eliminated include TJX Companies Inc., Great West Lifeco Inc., Great Bear Resources Ltd., and Fiserv Inc. The portfolio manager believes the changes to security holdings will benefit the fund over the medium to longer term period due to what the portfolio manager believes are more attractive risk/return dynamics.

The portfolio manager remains positive about the Fund's investments over the medium to longer term period due to what the portfolio manager believes are attractive fundamentals and reasonable valuations.

At the end of the Period, the Fund's asset mix consisted of 44.4% Canadian equities, 7.1% U.S. equities, 0.2% international equities, 40.0% fixed income and 8.3% cash and cash equivalents and short-term investments.

#### Related party transactions

Empire Life Investments Inc. (the "Manager") is the manager, trustee and portfolio manager of the Fund. The Manager is a wholly-owned subsidiary of The Empire Life Insurance Company.

The Manager provides or arranges for the provision of all the management and administrative services for the day-to-day operations of the Fund, including providing or arranging the provision of investment advice, record keeping and other administrative services, some of which are provided by an affiliate of the Manager. In consideration of the management and administrative services, the Fund pays the Manager a monthly management fee calculated as a percentage of daily net asset value of each series of the Fund, other than in the case of Series I, where fees are paid directly by the investor to the Manager. The rates for each series are disclosed under "Management fees".

During the Period, the Manager absorbed \$71,170 of total expenses otherwise payable by the Fund, as compared to \$70,951 for the six month period ended June 30, 2021. The amount of expenses waived or absorbed is determined annually on a series by series basis at the discretion of the Manager and the Manager can terminate the waiver or absorption at any time.

#### Series description

The Fund offers the following series: A, T6, T8, F and I. Series A, T6 and T8 units are available to all investors other than, effective May 1, 2022, investors who invested through discount brokers. Series T6 and T8 are designed for investors seeking regular monthly cash flows from the Fund. Series F units are available to investors who have a fee-based account with their dealer and whose dealer has signed an agreement with the Manager.

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In addition, Series F units may be available to other groups where the Manager does not pay commissions to the dealers, including discount brokers. Management fees are payable by the Funds on all series except Series I. Series I units are available to institutional and high-net-worth investors who meet a minimum investment threshold and who have entered into a Series I Agreement with the Manager. The management fee for Series I units is negotiated between the Manager and the investor and is payable directly to the Manager by the investor. Effective on or about May 1, 2022, investors who held Series A, T6 or T8 units through a discount broker had their series redesignated as Series F units.

(6) Management expense ratio (MER) is based on total expenses (excluding distributions, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.

(7) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.

(8) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

### Management fees

The management fee for Series A, T6, T8 and F units is an annualized rate calculated as a percentage of net assets of the applicable series of the Fund and accrued daily and paid monthly to the Manager. The management fee for Series I units is negotiated between the Manager and the investor and paid directly by the investor, not by the Fund.

The Fund's management fees are used by the Manager to pay for the costs of the overall business and affairs of the Fund including activities related to making units of the Fund available to investors, providing or arranging for the provision of investment advisory services and/or marketing services to the Fund. Management fees are also used to pay trailing commissions in connection with Series A, Series T6 and Series T8 to registered dealers.

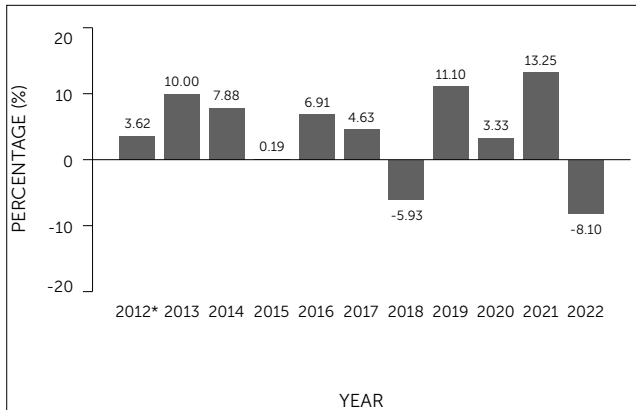
### Past performance

### Year-by-year returns

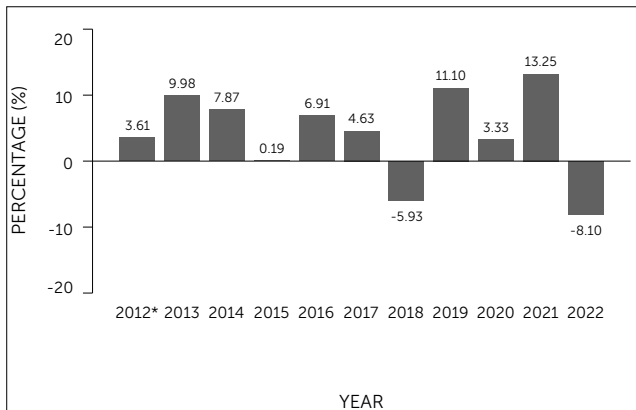

**Series A**



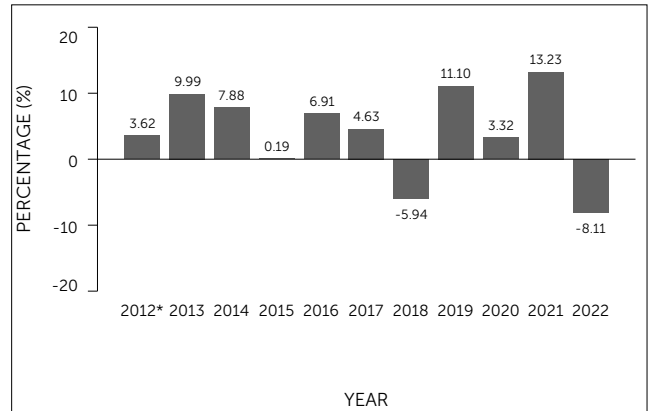

**Series T6**



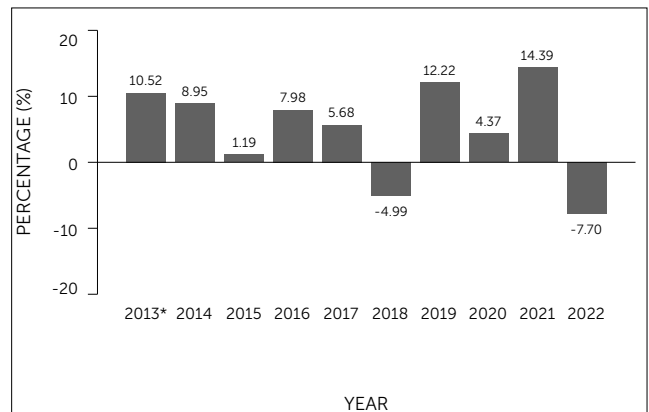

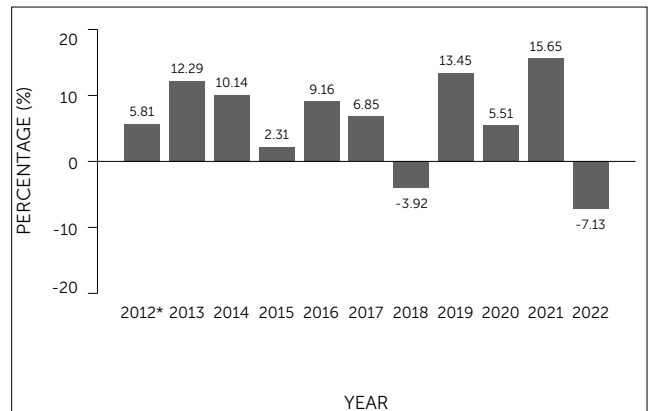
